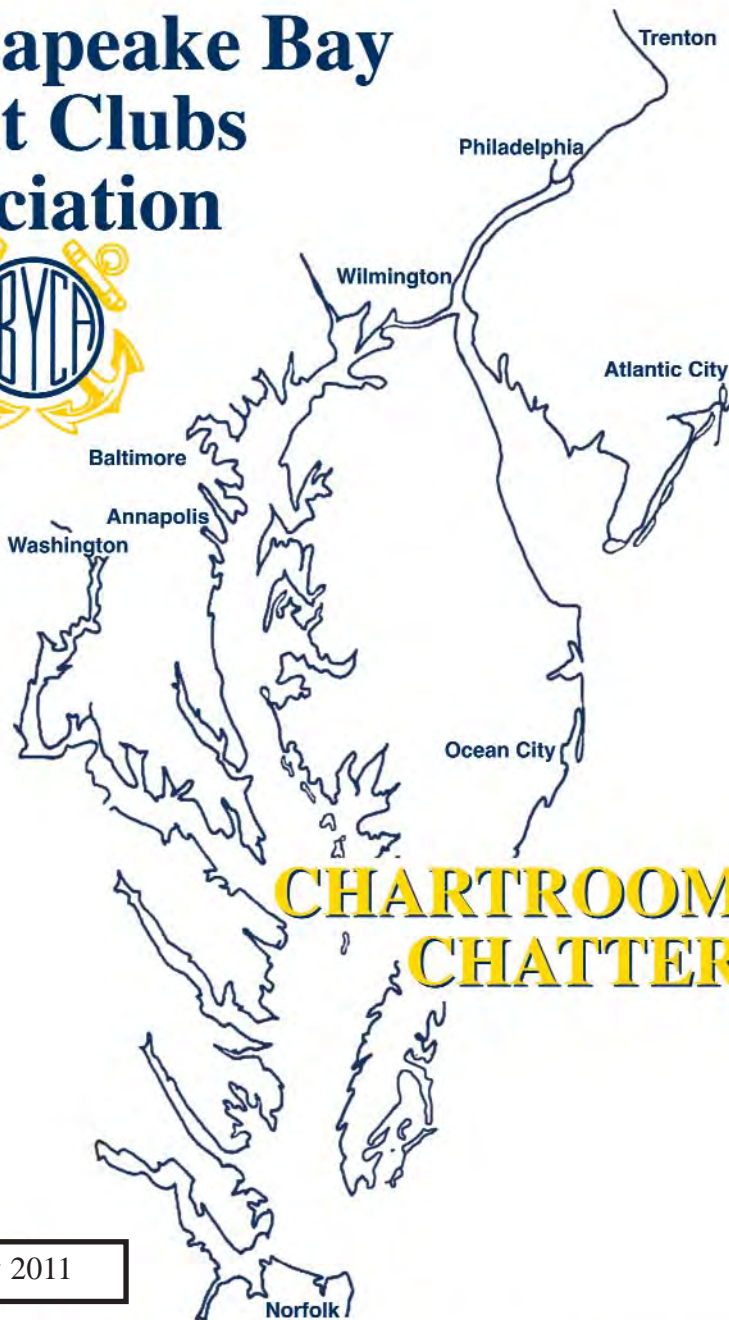

Government Relations Article, Boat US, Feb./March 2011: I know it is icy and cold on the Bay right now, and a perfect time to catch up with your reading. Take the time to read the Boat US Special Report, For Boaters, Fine Lines Come With State Border: Before you navigate your boat from one state's waters to the next, be sure you know whether or not you need a boater education certificate. For example, New Jersey requires boaters to pass a boater safety education course but not all NJ courses are National Association of State Boating Law Administrators-approved. Thus, if you're in Pennsylvania waters, you could be cited for violation of state law because PA requires boat operators to possess proof of successfully completing a NASBLA-approved course. I've asked some of our CBYCA leaders to work on an article to address this for Bay boaters. More later.

The federal government has allocated an additional 1.5 billion dollars to Maryland for management of storm water run off.

Maryland department of the environment (MDE) permitting general permit no. 10MA (NPDES no. MDG99) Effective Date: March 1, 2011 Expiration Date February 28, 2016, APPLY to facilities with this classification:

- Marinas
- Boating Clubs with Marinas
- Sailing Clubs with Marinas
- Yacht Clubs with Marinas
- Boatyards that provide storage and incidental repair

MDE permit covers **Eligible Discharges:**

- 1) Storm water runoff to surface or groundwater from establishments involved in boat maintenance (including ship rehab, mechanical repairs, painting maintenance and lubrication)
- 2) Wastewater from washing of boats and engines.
- 3) Non-contact cooling water and condensate discharges from ice machines, refrigeration units and other machinery; and
- 4) Bilge water collected and treated for discharge to surface or groundwater.

It is important that facilities listed above read all requirements, either for “no permit required” or “required” permits that are applicable.

The Environmental Protection Agency has unveiled its master plan for curbing Chesapeake Bay Pollution AND restoring the Bay by 2025. The latest restoration plan gives EPA a bigger say in what Maryland, five neighboring states, (VA, DE, PA, NJ & DC) must achieve to reduce what is known as TMDL - the total maximum daily load of pollution, in the form of sediments and nutrients that have so badly choked the bay and its tributaries. Should the States fail to achieve long term pollution reduction goals of 20 percent to 25 percent, they may be ordered to implement harsher regulatory measures than their governors or legislatures might otherwise have approved. How tough is the EPA going to be on its Big ticket items such as new sewage treatment plants or storm water management controls to prevent run-off that fouls creeks and streams when costs could run into BILLIONS of dollars.

The EPA's CLEAN WATER ACT requiring certain permitting at facilities where discharges can affect the tributaries of the five state Chesapeake Bay is noted in the just announced settlement : *EPA Settles Clean Water Act Case with Harrah's Casino for Unpermitted Waste Discharges to the Delaware River.*

Pennsylvania/New Jersey Legislative Report

Lake Erie wind farm clears another hurdle. Governor Ted Strickland is finishing out his four years as governor by signing a lease option that is key to building five massive wind turbines in state waters 7 miles offshore from Cleveland.

The move signals Strickland's support for the 100 million-dollar pilot project. If it's successful, Lake Erie Energy Development Corporation will be developing the country's first offshore wind farm. President Lorry Wagner hopes incoming governor John Kasich is not put off by Strickland's timing - In a sense it's like handing the baton to the next administration literally like in a race everyone is excited about working with Governor Kasich and his team.

The lease option gives LEED Co the rights to build anywhere within a 2 square mile area of Lake Erie. A final lease agreement with the state will be signed after studies show which sites are optimal for the turbines.

Harrisburg Fish and Boat Commissioner Chosen as PA Citizen Representative to Chesapeake Bay Commission. Former Franklin County Commissioner G. Warren Elliott was recently appointed by the Senate President Pro Tem and Lt. Gov. Joe Scarnati to be the Pennsylvania citizen representative to the Chesapeake Bay Commission. The Commission is a tri-state legislative assembly representing Pennsylvania, Virginia and Maryland designed to coordinate any related policy issues across state lines.

Elliott currently serves as a commissioner for the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission where he has gained a reputation as a strong advocate for expanded acquisition of permanent access easements to Pennsylvania's streams and rivers. Elliott serves as Chairman of the Pennsylvania Habitat and Environment Committee.

Mayor Michael A. Nutter and the Delaware River Waterfront Corporation (DRWC) announced plans for the next generation of waterfront projects. With initial early action projects either completed or well underway

DRWC prepares to transition into the next phase of work, which will be greatly facilitated by a new two-year, \$5 million grant by the William Penn Foundation. The grant will be used for ongoing development projects on the waterfront and will aid DRWC in realizing the goals outlined in the Master Plan for the Central Delaware. DRWC will leverage this grant to utilize existing capital reserves and actively seek additional grants.

The fundamental purpose of DRWC is to design, develop and manage the central Delaware River waterfront in Philadelphia between Oregon and Allegheny Avenues. DRWC intends to transform the central Delaware River waterfront into a vibrant destination location for recreational, cultural, and commercial activities for the residents and visitors of Philadelphia.

NMMA, Engine Manufacturers File Suit on E15 Decision

The National Marine Manufacturers Assc. (NMMA) filed suit in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D. C. Circuit, challenging the October 13, 2010 decision by the EPA to partially approve E15 for a subset of on-highway motor vehicles. NMMA has joined with

several other manufacturing groups in a newly formed coalition - the Engine Products Group (EPG) - in pursuing this legal challenge. NMMA expressed regret in having to pursue litigation, but stated that the EPA has not fulfilled its statutory obligations to ensure the safe introduction of E15. NMMA has urged full scientific testing on marine engines and equipment, as required by law, and the rational evaluation of policy mechanisms to protect consumers from misfueling and product failures caused by E15. In the meantime Congress is considering a bill that would shield retailers from liability suits for miss-fueled engines.

A related and significant issue is that subsidies (last year, \$7.7 billion) to the ethanol producers are set to automatically expire at the end of this year. While Republican fiscal hard liners worked to not continue the subsidies, the subsidies were included as part of the bill to continue the Bush tax cuts.

NBF Letter to US Coast Guard

We have sent a letter to the Commandant of the USCG and the Chief of the Office of Boating Safety, informing them of our concerns for the safety of the boating public with the presence of ethanol in marine fuel. While out on the water at night, in a storm or in a fog, engine failure could have disastrous consequences. To date the USCG does not appear to view ethanol as a safety issue.

Delaware's Chesapeake Plan Receives EPA Approval

DOVER (Dec. 29, 2010) - The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved Delaware's Chesapeake Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP; Phase I) for reducing pollutants from entering local waterways that lie within the Chesapeake Bay Watershed.

Delaware is among six Chesapeake Bay Watershed states that developed plans to help restore water quality of the Bay and its tidal waters by 2025, with 60 percent of the work to be completed by 2017.

Delaware's WIP details how the state will reduce excess pollutants and implement the state's portion of EPA's "pollution diet." The plan includes pollution reduction targets by geographic area and source - agriculture, urban stormwater, septic systems and wastewater treatment facilities.
